1. Masculine nouns that end in a consonant often have a corresponding feminine form that ends in "-a"

el doctor - la doctora (*the doctor*)

2. Some nouns that refer to people use the same form for both masculine and feminine. These nouns indicate gender by the article "**el**", "**la**".

el estudiante - la estudiante (*the student*)

3. Nouns that end in "**-sión, -ción, -dad, -tad, -tud, -umbre**" are feminine.

la televisión - *the television*

4. Some nouns that end in "**-a**" are masculine.

el problema - *the problem*

5. Many nouns that end in "**-ma**" are masculine.

el telegrama - *the telegram*

6. A few nouns that end in "**-ma**" are feminine

la cama - *the bed*

7. A few nouns that end in "**-o**" are feminine.

la mano - *the hand*

ESTAR

1- To address condition, use "estar". "Estar" is an irregular verb.
La sopa **está** caliente - The soup is hot (condition)

2- If you are talking about how something is, use "estar"
Él **está** enojado - He is mad

3- "Estar" is used to express geographic or physical locations.
Estoy en el trabajo.- I'm at work

Exception: The one exception to this rule is that "ser" is used to tell where an event is taking place.

La fiesta **es** en mi casa. - The party is at my house

4- "Estar" is used with adjectives to express a state or condition ("how" something is).
El agua **está** fría. - The water is cold.

5- "Estar" is used with many idiomatic expressions.
estar de acuerdo- to be in agreement
estar de pie- to be standing
estar en camino- to be on the way
estar en las nubes - to be daydreaming

6- "Estar" is used with the Progressive Tenses
Estoy estudiando Español - I am studying Spanish

SER

1- To address an essential quality, use "ser". "Ser" is also irregular.
El plátano **es** verde - The banana is green (quality)

2- If you are talking about what something is, use "ser".
Ella **es** una profesora - She is a teacher

3- "Ser" is used to express the hour, day, and date.
Son las dos. - It's two o'clock.

4- "Ser" is used to express place of origin.
Soy de Colombia. - I'm from Colombia.

5- "Ser" is used to express occupation.
Soy ingeniero - I'm an engineer

6- "Ser" is used to express nationality.
Ella **es** cubana - She's Cuban.

7- "Ser" is used to express religious or political affiliation.
Nosotros **somos** cristianos - We are christians

8- "Ser" is used to express the material something is made of.
Las mesas **son** de madera - The tables are (made of) wood

9- "Ser" is used to express possession.
El libro **es** de Carlos - The book is by Carlos

10- "Ser" is used to express the relationship of one person to another.
Ella **es** la esposa de mi tío - She is my uncle's wife

11- "Ser" is used with certain impersonal expressions.
Es necesario que llegue temprano - It is necessary to arrive early

12- "Ser" is used to tell where and when an event is taking place.
El cumpleaños **es** el sábado - The birthday is Saturday

13- "Ser" is used with adjectives to express inherent, or essential qualities.
María **es** inteligente - Maria is smart






